The Artefact AI Film Festival with mk2, chaired by Jean-Pierre Jeunet, reveals the winners of its international competition

Paris, France, November 18, 2024 – The Artefact AI Film Festival, created by Artefact and mk2, unveiled the winners of its international short film competition during an awards ceremony held at mk2 Bibliothèque in Paris. Presided over by renowned filmmaker Jean-Pierre Jeunet, the festival brought together innovative creators from across the globe, celebrating those who blend technology and art to redefine cinematic storytelling through the power of generative AI. This groundbreaking first edition was a major success, drawing 267 entries from 35 countries. Of these, 167 films were selected, leading to 20 finalists. Four prestigious awards were presented by a jury composed of cinema and AI experts, while the public was also invited to vote for their favorite films.

ARTEFACT AI FILM FESTIVAL AWARDS

The award-winning films were selected from 20 finalists, carefully chosen by mk2 programmers and vetted by Artefact's technical team. These original works explored the theme of "Reality(ies)," examining the profound transformations we are experiencing in the era of technological advancements and the new dimensions introduced by seeds and prompts. The short films challenge how we perceive and accept the world around us, reshaped by the emergence of artificial intelligence in our daily lives. The winning films are available to stream on mk2curiosity.com and on the Artefact Al Film Festival website, offering a wide audience the opportunity to discover these groundbreaking creations.

The winners of the 4 Awards of the 2024 edition are:

• Grand Prix: LA VIE QUAND T'AI MORT by Raphael Frydman

A poetic, introspective <u>short film</u> about life after death, seen through the eyes of a child. Surreal, funny and moving, it explores the mysteries of existence in a unique way, at the crossroads of animation and virtual reality. Prize of €10,000 awarded to the best film of the festival. In addition to the prize, a trailer of the winning film will be screened as a preview in all mk2 network cinemas from November 20 to December 3.

• Jury Prize: JAMAIS NANSA SOUVENIRS by Ella Bedia

This intimate <u>film</u> tells the story of a young woman who revisits the past of her grandfather, an Algerian immigrant, through the prism of artificial intelligence, offering a moving tribute to memory and family history. 1000€ prize awarded to the film that impressed the jury with its cinematographic qualities and originality.

• Audience Award: A DREAM by Evgenia Shabunina (ejaneress)

This short film explores modern anxiety through the prism of the director's childhood dream, depicting the way our brains react to the incessant flow of information in the age of social networking.

1000€ prize awarded to the most popular film, the one with the most public votes registered on the Artefact AI Film Festival website.

Best Use of Al Award: E^(Iπ) + 1 = 0* by Junie Lau

A fascinating <u>film</u> in which a former mathematical genius becomes the creator of an infinite digital universe, questioning the boundaries between reality and fiction through the avatars of a quest for truth. This special prize, supported by Mediawan, rewards the film that makes the best or most innovative use of artificial intelligence. The prize is an incubator for the next film (supporting the development and production of a new cinematographic work).
